




## The Scotchman Motor Restaurant was the place to see and be seen from the mid 50's to 1975.

"Once again Looking Glass Corvette Association is hosting the annual Scotchman Tribute all Corvette Show this July. Last year the RMC had over 20 gorgeous Corvettes with Looking Glass Corvette Association later mentioning to John Marsico and at their monthly meeting that the RMC cars were the hit of the show. The event is open to all Corvette owners and is a mere \$10.00 registration fee. For those people who are not from the Denver area, The Scotchman Motor Restaurant was the place to see and be seen from the mid-1950s until the Scotchman's closure in 1975. This really was the teenage hangout back in the day. To help with a mental image, think Mel's Diner in California, or the hangout in American Graffiti. The restaurant was located on North Federal Blvd between 47th and 48th Avenues on the East side of the street. Today, a Wendy's burger restaurant occupies the space. The Scotchman building was torn down after it closed to make way for the Wendy's.

The show will be held on Sunday, July 28, 2019 beginning at 10:00 am and ending at 2:00 pm. The location is in Wheat Ridge at Anderson Park, just a half block South of 44th Ave. on Field Street. The show is basically a an event with the goal of encouraging Corvette owners to gather, admire the cars and get to know each other. Each participant will receive a dash plaque and goody bag. 

## There have been several new judging manuals released recently.

At our March 23<sup>rd</sup> chapter meeting, I held a judging school outlining the policies and procedures involved in the new Concours judging division. The most important take away of this school is that the car has to have started life as a Corvette. This new division opens the judging door for all of those cars that won't judge well in the flight judging category, but are great looking/driving Corvettes.

On May 19<sup>th</sup> we will be holding our annual chapter judging meet at Medved Chevrolet in Wheat Ridge. If you signed up for the meet last November, you are signed up for this meet in May. If you were signed up for the November meet, and can't make the May meet, I need to know so I can assign someone else to your judging position. If you weren't signed up for the November meet, and want to participate in the May meet, the online registration is open.

There have been several new judging manuals released recently, note ably the 58-60, the 70-72 and the 73-74. All of the new manuals include pictures in color and are very comprehensive. They cost a little more, but contain a lot more information. If you own a car manufactured during one of those years, I suggest you should consider obtaining one of those manuals.

One of the board positions open at our annual meeting in April is my position as Judging Chairman. Since I will be busy with the judging at our regional next year, I have decided not to run for our chapter judging chairman position for the next two years, beginning 1/1/2020.
